### The Four Noble Truths & the Eightfold Path to ...

The Buddha's teachings on the Four Noble Truths are sometimes compared to a physician diagnosing an illness and prescribing a treatment. The first truth tells us what the illness is and the second truth tells us what causes the illness. The Third Noble Truth holds out hope for a cure. The solution to dukkha is to stop clinging and attaching.

### What Are the Four Noble Truths of Buddhism?

The Four Noble Truths Buddha's teachings are summarised in The Four Noble Truths which were taught in his first sermon. Their origins lie in inherited Indian religious beliefs in rebirth, karma and liberation. All life is suffering —pleasure is impermanent. The origin of suffering is desire — we should not attach ourselves to impermanent things.
