A "Turtle Diagram" is a process improvement tool (schematic visual representation) of the key elements that make up a single process. In short, a turtle diagram is used to illustrate the 1-page plan for a single process including the resources needed to achieve the process's purpose.

Instructions For Creating A Turtle Diagram — Concentric Global

A turtle diagram is a visual tool used to define individual processes. It helps map out the elements of a process during a process audit. It helps understand the processes under audit in terms of input/output, process owner, responsibilities, resources, measurement, competence, interactions with other processes, methods, and equipment.

We have found the turtle diagram a useful tool for auditing a process. The auditor starts with Step 1 and interviews the process owner to obtain a description of the process and discuss the resources necessary (Step 2). Then various participants in the process are interviewed to audit the inputs, activities and outputs of the process (Steps 3, 4 and 5).
